In 1982, the Journal published Volume XIV (Nos. 1-2, Winter-Spring 1981), Volume XIV (Nos. 3-4, Summer-Autumn 1981), and Volume XV (Nos. 1-4, 1982). The first includes articles by Ahmad Ashraf, Shaul Bakhash, and Guity Nashat. The second incudes articles by Donald Stilo, Kambiz Afrashteh, and Richard Antoun. The third, guest-edited by Michael Hillmann, is an annual devoted to Literature and Society in Iran.

We are proud to announce that with the help of the previous editor, Ali Banuazizi, we have caught up with our schedule of publications. We intend to keep abreast of our publication deadline in the future. If any member of the Society has not received these recent issues, he or she should contact the editors. The next issue of the Journal, Volume XVI (No. 1, Winter 1983), will include articles on peasant attitudes towards the Islamic Republic, silk trade in nineteenth-century Iran, as well as a bibliographic appendum on the Iranian Revolution. Our tentative plans for 1983 and 1984 include special issues on the peasantry, art and archeology, and Shi'i political thought. The last topic will be published as a special issue in honor of the late Hamid Enayat.

In the past year, Ahmad Ashraf (New School for Social Research) and Lois Beck (Washington University), joined the Journal's editorial board. Robert McChesney (New York University) was appointed the Journal's associate editor.

Conference

The Second Annual Conference of the Center for Iranian Research and Analysis on Revolution, Counterrevolution and the Islamic Republic, was held on April 2-3, 1983 at the American University in Washington, D.C. The focus of the conference was various aspects of Iran's political economy, culture and art during the past four years, with emphasis on the struggle for democracy. Topics were to include ideologies and movements, minorities, oil and capital accumulation, relations with the superpowers and the Arab world, agriculture, social classes, daily life, conflicts within the regime, opposition groups, Iranians in exile, law, education and social psychology. Special attention was to be given to the role of women in each category.
